


A MINISTRY OF THE PAULIST FATHERS

A Survivor of the 1906 earthquake and fire, this



major historical landmark has been retrofitted to meet new seismic codes; however, we must now comply with the American Disability Act and refurbish the interior of this beautiful old cathedral. WHAT DID JESUS THINK ABOUT POLITICS? A REFLECTION BY PAULIST FR. JOE SCOTT



Jesus knew more about politics than we might realize. He was familiar with all the political parties of his time.

The Herodians were those who followed the legacy of Herod the Great, the Jewish King who actually built the Temple. Herod's sons continued to be rulers after his death, but didn't do a very good job of it. Herod (called Antipas) was fascinated by John the Baptist as a potential crowd-drawing rival, and put him to death. He was VERY interested in the whereabouts of Jesus, especially after Jesus publicly referred to him as "that fox."

All the Herodians were about allegiance to Rome, where all their power derived. They asked Jesus to publicly proclaim his approval of Roman money, on which Caesar's image was placed. Jesus replied, "If Caesar made the coin, and if his image is on it, then you can give him what belongs to him. But the truly important thing is to give your allegiance to God, who wants only your love.

The Sadducees were the ruling power in Jerusalem, associated with the High Priest and the Temple. Their king was Caesar. They were the Jewish group that was most friendly toward the Gentiles. They permitted Roman money to be exchanged for Jewish money on the Temple grounds. Everyone made money off this, but Jesus chased the money changers away. From that moment, the Sadducees were the political party most supportive of Jesus' arrest and death.

The Zealots were the revolutionaries who didn't spent much time in Jerusalem or Galilee. They had their headquarters in the mountains, where they plotted a violent overflow of the Romans. Some Zealots wanted to make Jesus their leader, but he refused, and said "those who live by the sword will die by the sword." The Zealots quickly lost interest in a non-violent King.

Pharisees were the political party most visible in Jerusalem, and fairly common in Galilee. They were laymen (there were no women leaders in any of these four parties – it was a totally patriarchal world). St. Paul was raised as a Pharisee.

Of all these four groups, Jesus got along best with the Pharisees. They liked to debate the law, and so did he. But they disagreed on their attitudes toward strangers. Pharisees wanted to associate with only good, pure Jews like themselves. Jesus reached out to everyone, especially those who were not perfect. The Pharisees wanted only the perfect.

If Jesus were a political party, what would his platform be? It would have two planks:

- 1. "Know the truth, and the truth will set you free."
- 2. "Be compassionate, as your heavenly Father is compassionate."

Which of today's political parties comes closest to Jesus' platform?
