


1. Many and great are bearers of the Word: the Christ speaks; the heart seeks. Gathered as one, we listen to the Word and share the meal of new birth.

Refrain: The wheat grows from springtime to fall; the wine flows; in Christ we recall the sharing of our lives with one and all.


- 2. Many and great are seeds upon the field: the hand sows; the seeds grow. Take now and eat the covenant fulfilled, the bread of promise and life.


